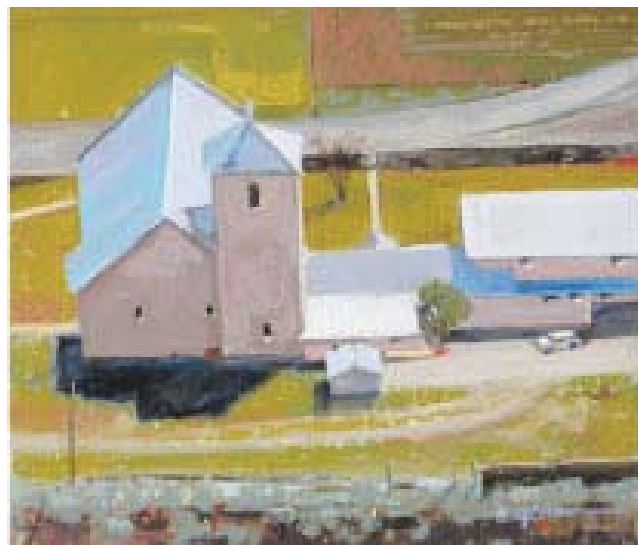

I am very excited to announce our workshop instructor and judge for our membership show this year! Many of you may not be familiar with Dinah's work so I would like to introduce her here.

The workshop takes place August 13-14 at the Windberg Art Center. Tuition for the workshop is \$225 with a deposit of \$75 due by May 21 to hold your space. Her work stands out for her strong, unique designs and for her wonderful color sense. Her latest series of work includes aerial views which is a groundbreaking new direction for Dinah as she presents a serene and pastoral world from the air in oils and pastels, some breathtaking and relatively traditional, while others offer perspectives of the countryside as the pure geometry of roads and fields.

Dinah's landscape paintings are instantly recognizable for their clarity and depth. Light is everywhere. It filters through the trees and streams, between the clouds. She is able to retain this vitality because she is continually renewing her vision. Dinah uses various methods of staying fresh such as

switching back and forth from oil to pastel or intentionally mixing up her palette. This forces her to focus on the subject at hand rather than on a habitual way of approaching the image. Dinah states, "I constantly work to press beyond method and into a flow of creative instinct."

## **Student & Friend To Share Stories of Texas' Premiere Pastel Artist**

Lucretia Coke, Frank Reaugh's longtime student and friend, will be our guest speaker April 16th.

Reaugh stands out in Texas history as one of our premiere artists. He was best known for his plein air pastels depicting life on the Texas prairies. He was born in 1861 and built a sixty year career as an artist and teacher. His extensive collection of paintings is on display at the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum in Canyon, the Texas Tech University Library, the Southwest collection in Lubbock and the University of Texas in Austin.

During the years of 1888-1898 Frank Reaugh studied art in Paris but returned to his beloved Texas which he explains in this excerpt from his writings:

*"Other painters of that day were busy crossing the water to paint the peasantry of the old world, or were satisfied with the hills or coastline of the East. Indeed, there was little opportunity or inducement for them in the barren cattle country. The cattle were wild and the range was vast and barren. There was hardship and danger, and from the cowboys little welcome. For me, however, the great southwestern cow country had a wondrous charm."*

During the program, Mrs. Coke will be interviewed about her years painting with Reaugh as one of his many students. She will bring paintings from that time as well as an easel used during those painting trips among the cowboys and cattle of the Texas plains.

It's a real treat for us to hear the stories that bring history to life and learn of his teachings beginning for Ms. Coke from the age of 14 till his death in 1945. Look at [www.FrankReaugh.com](http://www.FrankReaugh.com) for more information.

Members may enter 1 painting in each of the eight 2010/2011 challenge subjects up to a total of 8 paintings. In keeping with the purpose of the challenge paintings, only new work completed during 2010/2011 year will be shown. This could include paintings started during our August 2010 workshop.

President Nancy Taylor and Exhibit Chair Susan Spohn announce that a Best of Show award is being donated by Dalhart Windberg and a cash award in honor of Rita Lallathin. Also ribbons will be given in all eight challenge subjects.

Acting as judges at this event will be Dalhart Windberg and Michael Windberg

Dalhart Windberg and Michael Windberg are also exhibiting their artwork in this event while showcasing Central Texas Pastel Society. The public will be invited to this event which will be a good opportunity to push yourself artistically and share your work with others. Paintings do not need to be for sale.

### **About our judges...**

Legendary Texas artist, Dalhart Windberg, has a long line of awards and tributes to his credit. In 1967 he quit teaching in order to paint full-time. By 1972, Windberg was the sole artist of the American Masters Foundation; seven years later, he was named Texas State Artist. Today, he continues to paint at his gallery at the Windberg Art Center.

Dalhart Windberg's eldest son, Michael Windberg, has made his own mark as a serious painter of Texas art themed landscapes and historical subjects. Michael has also gained a unique painting perspective from his work as an art conservator.

The monthly challenge paintings will continue to be presented at our remaining meetings. However, members still have time to start new paintings to enter the exhibit as long as the paintings fit the descriptions.

The prospectus for the exhibition will be emailed to members early March.

Here's a complete list of Challenge Subjects:

### **September – “Secret Life of Everyday Things”**

Seeing the beauty in ordinary objects in a still life painting. Think of objects not commonly painted, examples might include mechanical parts or a lamp.

**October – “Oh, the Places We've Been”** Paintings done from places other than Texas. This is the time to pull out those vacation photos and come up with a painting...the more exotic the locale the better!

### **November – “Private Moments in Public Spaces”**

Capturing people in their fleeting unguarded moments.

**December - “Big City Lights”** Night scenes of the city which could even include fireworks or Christmas lights.

**January - “Reflections of Myself”** Taking a look at ourselves in a painting. How we, the artists, see themselves."

**February – “Breaking Down the Elements”** Simplifying landscapes into abstract shapes.

**March – “The Other Wildflowers of Texas”** Bluebonnets and Paint Brushes are beautiful but let's give all the other flowers of Texas a spot in the limelight.

**April – “Stormy Weather”** – Everybody knows April brings showers but we'll include all kinds of stormy weather from drizzles to tornados to blizzards and everything in between.

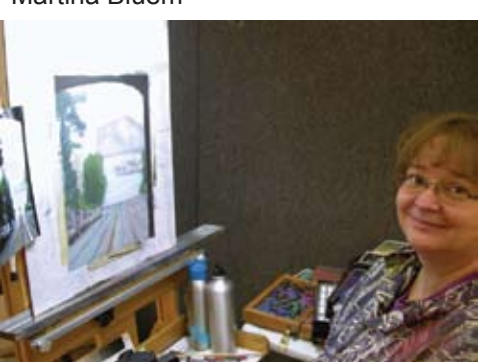

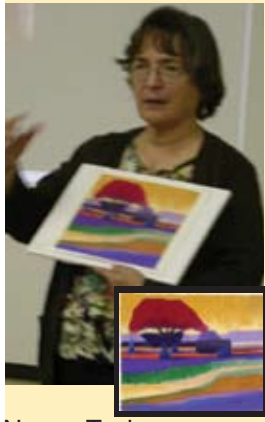
## Artist Co-operative is Forming

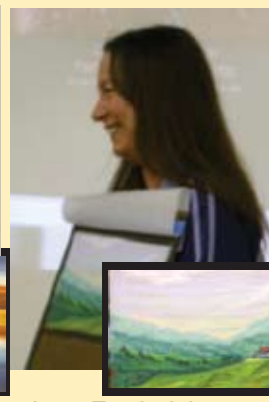
